

## Better Derbyshire Dales Fund Further information for applicants

Last year (2016-17) a total of £54,000 was awarded in small grants to fifty groups. The average capital grant was £1500 and the average revenue grant was £750.

Here are some example of groups we have supported in the past: -

Tideswell Afternoon Tea Club

Awarded £539 towards room hire, meeting expenses and an outing.

Derwent Valley Junior Football League

Awarded £1915 towards six safeguarding courses; six coaching courses and ten 'respect' barriers.

• Great Longstone Village Hall

Awarded £3500 towards the upgrading of the kitchen facilities in the hall

ACE Youth Trust

Awarded £1,000 sessional funding for 16+project leader to operate a weekly drop in session in Ashbourne for local young people aged 16+ who are not in education, employment or training and/or missing education.

Some common reasons that applications are turned down:

- Not showing clear benefit to people in the Derbyshire Dales area
- Having a limited benefit such as a facility that isn't open to all
- Planning permission, legal structure of group or similar organisational management not yet in place (we usually ask the applicant to submit their application again when these things are in place)
- Not having a properly thought out budget
- Having a turnover of over £50,000 in previous financial years

In addition it is possible that an application from a previous recipient of award could be turned down where the evaluation form has not been completed and submitted without good reason.
