➤ Testing in England

There were **903,438** tests reported on 21 November 2021. This shows an increase of **2.6%** compared to the previous 7 days. Between 15 November 2021 and 21 November 2021, there have been **5,748,405** tests.

➤ Cases in Derbyshire Dales

39 new people had a confirmed positive test result reported on 22 November 2021. Between 16 November 2021 and 22 November 2021, **272** people had a confirmed positive test result. This shows an increase of **23.6%** compared to the previous 7 days.

➤ Vaccinations in Derbyshire Dales

60,285 people had been given a first dose by the end of 21 November 2021.
56,199 people had been given a second dose by the end of 21 November 2021.

➤ Healthcare in Derby & Burton NHS Foundation Trust

6 people with coronavirus went into hospital on 14 November 2021. Between 8 November 2021 and 14 November 2021, **55** went into hospital with coronavirus. This shows an increase of **17.0%** compared to the previous 7 days. There were **48** patients in hospital with coronavirus on 16 November 2021.

➤ Deaths in Derbyshire Dales

Between 16 November 2021 and 22 November 2021, there has been **1** death within 28 days of a positive coronavirus test. This shows a decrease of **-80.0%** compared to the previous 7 days.

Coronavirus in the UK



Vaccination updates

Joined Up Careers Derbyshire is calling for more volunteers to help with the ongoing Covid-19 vaccination programme. The public responded brilliantly to the Call to Arms campaign, which asked for volunteers to support the Covid-19 vaccination programme in its early stages. More are still needed. Susan Spray, programme lead for Joined Up Careers Derbyshire, said: "This is a chance for more people to take part in a crucial aspect of the country's ongoing response to the coronavirus pandemic. Derbyshire begins booster vaccinations for 40+, 2nd doses for 16-17 year-olds

This week sees a new phase begin in the Covid-19 vaccination programme, as people aged 40-49 become eligible for their booster dose and 16-17-year-olds can get their second dose.

Boosters give over 90% protection against catching COVID-19 in adults over 50. Vaccines save lives and are our best line of defence from COVID-19 being spread and serious illness. The booster programme has been expanded to cover those aged 40 to 49. If you are eligible for a booster you can book your appointment online after five months. You can also call 119 or use a walk-in job centre after six months from your second jab. [NHS Booking Service](#)

This week is 'Carbon Monoxide' Awareness week. As the days get colder and the heating is turned on, the potential risks of CO poisoning increase.




What is carbon monoxide? Carbon monoxide is a poisonous gas produced by unsafe gas appliances. You cannot see it or smell it but it can cause death and serious injuries. Oil and solid fuels such as coal, wood, petrol and oil can also produce carbon monoxide.
